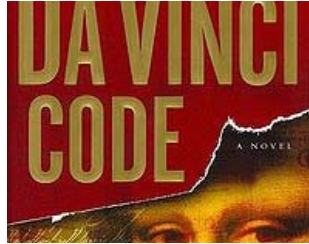

**Da Vinci Code Tour**

The Da Vinci Code Walking Tour of Paris will take you through the pages of Dan Brown's sweeping novel that has engulfed the world with intrigue. Follow the adventure of renowned Harvard symbolist Robert Langdon as he searches for the hidden clues that lie throughout Paris. Find out where the truth stops and the fiction begins!

The tour begins at the famous Hotel Ritz, where the novel opens with Robert Langdon fast asleep. Walk through the Jardin des Tuileries and enjoy the beautiful gardens as we enlighten you to a few of the author's liberties taken in the writing of this book.

From there, you will enter the Carrousel du Louvre, where Silas murdered the museum curator Jacques Saunier, to see the inverted pyramid believed to house the Holy Grail itself. Next, cross the Pont des Arts on your way to the gallery district of the Left Bank.

This walk will take us to the Church of St. Germain des Pres before closing the tour at the final destination, St. Sulpice. Please note that the St. Sulpice may be closed on Sundays for Mass. Here you will view the infamous Rose Line and take a look inside this dramatic church. Follow the Rose Line to the towering obelisk where Silas mistakenly believed the Holy Grail rested.
