and one of the most important documentation centres in existence relating to the conquest of America. Another important Renaissance building in the city is the Casa de Pilatos, a palace that fuses Gothic and Mudejar elements with Renaissance influences of Italian origin. You can also approach the baroque façade of the Royal Tobacco Factory, now the University and the San Telmo Palace. This will then lead you to the Guadalquivir river, where you will find the Torre del Oro, of Arab origin, which dates back to the 13th century and was part of the ancient walls.

Finally, you will arrive at Plaza de España, built because of the Ibero-american Exhibition of 1929. Its floor plan is semicircular. It is dominated by 2 towers, one on each side of the enclosed area, which frame the central building where the main rooms are. Between the two towers runs a network of galleries with an arcade of semicircular arches leading to exits in different parts of the square, where the fountain stands.
